Hope you all had a pleasant 4th of July. We have about 60 fireworks sales spots, and I am sure they were all busy before and after the holiday. We always have a river festival each year, and this one was no different. Air shows, food, rides, games, and oh yes, fireworks. I did not feel up to the strenuous program it would cause. It was about a mile walk from a place to park for many people.

First thing to come to my mind is the progress of my pelvic fracture. I was released from the hospital in 3 weeks, and was followed with home visits for 2 more weeks. I was let out to dry 2 days ago by the visiting nurse, by my attending Orthopedic MD, and finally by my internist. I am able to drive when sking me to go to a locate concerning citizens of the US who were honored at the French 60th D-Day Memorial. It was a complimentary item on the life and works of our own Abe Plotkin, who received the French Legion of Honor Award which was bestowed upon 100 Americans as symbolic gesture for the millions of our boys who fought in the war.

I received news that Lorene Althoff died in January of this year. She wrote me several times years, and was a friend of Virgil Pugh. I wrote the people who reported her death a nice note, and I will remove her name from our roster.

Well, bad things happen in threes, so watch out all of you. My daughter Nancy fell out of her door Tuesday of this week, exactly as I had about 4 years ago. I broke my left shoulder at that time, but she was luckier. She got sort of the same injury I recently suffered, but I don't think she broke anything. She's using my walk aids, and I am glad to get rid of them for a while.

Received a welcome call from Clair Schneider about the 19th. He had just talked with the Stensbergs, and things were going well there. Of course, we discuss everything, but solve nothing. He did not make his annual trip to the east coast this year when his son went. He is in good health, but something else must have gotten in his vision, and we old ones only do one thing at a time. Clair had called me while I was in the hospital, and left his mark in my mail box. He did not neglect reminding me that us older guys have one foot on a banana peeling, and I sure agreed with that.

We discussed everything from the election to the use of artificial sweetener, but solved not a thing. We try, though. It is always great to hear from Clair. He was going to call Ray Crismond later, he thought.

He was sorry to hear about Bill Hartley. He did not know him while in service, but got to know him well through his battalion activities. I suspect that we still are in touch with about 70 of the group by mail, but under 20 thru close contact.

I had asked my brother Dale to see if Joe Molnar was still in Sebring. Dale told me that his phone number was changed, and he thought it was an Illinois number (Cicero, III he believes). If anyone is in touch with Joe, have him send me his new address. If I hear more, I will put it in later.

I received a letter from John and Helen Ehmen concerning the death of Alice Edwards. She had been ill for some time, and on May 1 she passed away. I had reported that she was being helped by friends, but did not survive.

John has had rheumatoid arthritis for many years, and is still being bothered with this condition. He is otherwise doing well after having had bypass and aneurysm surgery in the late 1990's. He enjoys reading the newsletter, and I thank the Ehmen's for reporting Alice's death.

I drove over to my home town yesterday to see my brother Gene and his wife. They came up from Florida for a few weeks to visit family, and I decided to pop over to say HI. They are doing well, and will be back in Florida in a few weeks, and I may just go down to see them.

My poor aching hip is getting better, I think. I have more strength in the crazy leg, and the pain is much improved. I kept telling you not to get old, and darned if I didn't ignore my best advice, and do it myself. I got hearing aids at the same time I was in the hospital, and I still am underwhelmed with the crazy things.

As I earlier mentioned, things happen in 3's in this world. A week ago my nephew, Gene's son) was working in his insurance office in Robinson, IL., and one of his clients was coming in to pay her insurance premium. Well, she did just that. She hit the accelerator instead of the brake, hit the parking block at the building, and it bounded her car right into the office. My nephew was standing next to the desk by the wall, and the desk knocked him into the room opposite, bruised up the secretary working at the desk, and also banged up the driver also. Allen, the son, was taken to the ER along with the driver, and ambulances from the next county took the other injured to the local facility.

The orthopedic doctor on call told my family that there was no way they could handle the injured nephew, whose leg was badly deformed and obviously fractured. I happened to know the doctor there, and he wisely recommended that Allen be treated in a major trauma center, and the one chosen was here in St. Louis. In any event, he was brought to St. Louis, and was checked in at the St. Louis University Hospital for treatment. He has been here now for 9 or 10 days, has had to have a rod placed in his left thigh, and is being checked out to see if a heart murmur he has is significant. He apparently had been turned down for military service, but did not tell anyone about this problem. So he is just now being completed for this defect, and will probably go home tomorrow, very much in discomfort, and will be taken to a rehab facility for more therapy.

I have had no more contact with our group, so I am going to get this on the way. The hurricane season is about to start in earnest down in Florida, and I plan getting down there soon to see what needs to be done about the situations there.
